A great divide between the demand for innovation in health and health innovation policies

- Governance mechanisms in health stifles the demand for innovation
- Innovation policies are mostly supply driven
- Reaping the benefits of innovative medicine will require a major culture change in our health system
 - leadership at the highest level of governments
 - breaking silos between departments
 - open and transparent information systems
 - an important reform of the health system and its culture to foster accountability and autonomy

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- Incentives foster:
 - Accountability towards value for patient (defined by them)
 - Care organised around patient conditions
 - Integrated services
 - Payments allocated for the full cycle of care
 - Single electronic patient records accessible throughout the whole system
 - Multiyear perspective
- Timely, secured and accessible data (clinical and administrative) for research and management purposes
